President's Message: Glenys MacRae

Orchid Show season is swiftly coming to a close with the last shows of the year taking place this weekend in Hawke's Bay and on the North Shore of Auckland where both societies will be holding Sarcochilus and other genera shows. An attractive range of orchids were on display in the photos I saw from the recent Bay of Islands and Canterbury shows. Last weekend I participated in the Howick Orchid Society Show. It was a lovely day and it was pleasing to see the public come through to view the orchids and purchase plants.

More Judges Needed – Please Consider

The OCNZ system of orchid judging is designed to recognise new or superior forms of orchid species and hybrids, leading to improvement in the shape and the colour of the flowers in all orchid genera. The system also recognises the growers of plants showing superior culture. However, to maintain the judging system we need to continually recruit new judges. Currently, there are 72 accredited judges but with an average of 5 retirements a year over the past 5 years — and as it can take up to 4 years to train and become an accredited judge — we need at least 20 associate judges coming through the system just to maintain current numbers. Unfortunately, we currently have only 4 associates.

Judges make a sincere, long-term commitment, and give much of their personal time and resources. In return they acquire knowledge on a wide range of orchid genera, species and hybrids, and hybridisation and breeding trends.
